## School Dental Screenings

Niagara Region Public Health Dental Program will be offering <u>Dental screening</u> to grades JK, SK, 2, 4, 7 and 8 on April 29-30, 2024.

A registered dental hygienist will take a quick look in the child's mouth using a sterilized mirror and light. Staff will be wearing a mask, eye protection, gloves and performing hand hygiene between each student.

The <u>Healthy Smiles Ontario</u> program may financially assist children who do not have access to dental care.

If you do not want your child(ren) to take part in the dental screening, you MUST complete the online <u>School Dental Screening Nonparticipation Form</u> or call the Dental Health Line at 905-688-8248 or 1-888-505-6074 ext. 7399 each school year.

If your child(ren) is not in one of the grades listed above, they may have the opportunity to participate in the dental screening. If you would like your child to be screened, please complete the School Dental Participation Form.
